What is this product?

Type

The product is a share class of the sub-fund Franklin Global Income and Growth Opportunities Fund (the "Fund") which is part of Franklin Templeton Investment Funds, an open-ended investment company with variable capital (SICAV), qualifying as a UCITS.

Term

The Fund has no maturity date. The Fund could be closed under the conditions laid down in the current prospectus of the Fund.

Objectives

Investment Objective

To seek to maximise income and growth of capital (total return) over the long term.

Investment Policy

The Fund mainly invests in equities, corporate and government bonds. These investments may be from anywhere in the world, including emerging markets. The Fund may invest significantly in below investment grade and unrated bonds.

These investments may include convertible securities, including contingent convertible bonds, and asset- and mortgage-backed securities, and real estate Funds. To a lesser extent, the Fund may invest in distressed securities including securities that are in default or issued by companies that are restructuring or going through bankruptcy.

Derivatives and techniques The Fund may use derivatives for reducing risks (hedging) and costs, and to generate additional income or growth.

Strategy The investment manager combines macroeconomic, interest rate, credit and issuer analysis to flexibly allocate investments across asset classes based on market conditions. For each asset class, the investment manager then selects securities that appear to offer both attractive income and total return potential.

Benchmark(s) Blended 50% MSCI ACWI High Dividend Yield-NR, 20% Bloomberg Global High Yield Corporate and 30% Bloomberg Global Aggregate Index. Used for performance comparison only.

Share Class Policy

The income received from the Fund's investments is accumulated with the result of increasing the value of the shares.

Buying and selling shares

You may normally buy or sell shares on any day the New York Stock Exchange is open for business.

Intended retail investor

Investors who understand the risks of the Fund and plan to invest for at least 5 years. The Fund may appeal to investors who:

- are looking for a combination of income and investment growth
- are interested in exposure to a mixed asset allocation globally as part of a diversified portfolio
- have a medium to high risk profile and can tolerate significant short-term changes in the share price

Product availability The Fund is available to all investors with at least basic investment knowledge, through a wide range of distribution channels, with or without the need for advice.

Terms to understand

asset- and mortgage- backed securities: Bonds backed by consumer debt (such as mortgages, credit card and other loan-type debt) and whose income derives from the payments received from the underlying borrowers.

bonds, below investment grade: Bonds represent an obligation to repay a debt, along with interest. Below investment grade bonds generally pay higher interest rates but are considered less likely to make all scheduled payments or repay the initial debt.

convertible securities, contingent convertible bonds: Bonds that convert into shares of a company upon a pre-determined event occurring. Contingent convertible bonds generally pay higher interest payments compared to other bonds due to the higher risk.

derivatives: Financial instruments whose value is linked to one or more rates, indexes, share prices or other values.

emerging markets: Markets of less economically developed nations, such as some nations in Asia, Africa, Eastern Europe and Latin America.

equities: Securities that represent partial ownership of a company.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk Indicator

What happens if Franklin Templeton International Services S.à r.l. is unable to pay out?

Franklin Templeton International Services S.à r.l. ("FTIS") is the management company of the Fund, but the assets of the Fund are held separately from FTIS by the depositary. J.P. Morgan SE, Luxembourg branch, as the appointed depositary, is liable to the Fund or its shareholders for losses caused by its negligent or intentional failure to fulfill its safekeeping or record-keeping obligations (cash could however be lost in case of default of the depositary or its delegates).

There is no compensation or guarantee scheme protecting you from a default of the Fund's depositary.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over Time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario
